ABOUT THE SCHOOL AND THE CITY

Latin America Academy, who also own and operate a well established school in Quito, Ecuador, invites you to study Spanish immersed in the unique culture of Bolivia. Located in the heart of Sucre in a quiet historic, colonial area, just a few blocks away from the city center, Latin America Academy offers a high quality program focusing on the four basic language skills: listening, grammar, oral and written comprehension. Classes are held in a 2 story building with seven classrooms, kitchen, a salon (for videos, etc.) a flat roof, nice roomy balcony, an interior patio, a small area to get sun tan. Access to e-mail is free at the school for students with no access to the internet.

All Latin America Academy teachers have a University Degree in Spanish Philology and have been carefully selected because of their qualifications and experience in teaching Spanish as a foreign language. Some of them are Doctors or have Master Degrees in teaching Spanish and literature, history or Latinamerican culture. They refresh their teaching skills, receiving special courses every year from our International Academic Director in Ecuador. Latin America Academy in Bolivia is registered with and recognized by the Bolivian Ministry of Education.

Sucre is the beautiful colonial judicial capital located in the Andean highlands of Bolivia. Known as the "White City of the Americas" due to its numerous colonial buildings, all of which are painted in white and topped with shiny red tile roofs. Set in a valley surrounded by low mountains, Sucre is small (pop. 150,000) so that it is very easy to explore on foot. A university town, known as the center of learning and progressive thought, Sucre has many museums, a central plaza, shops and restaurants.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Latin America Academy in Bolivia offers nine levels of study in accordance with ACTFL (American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages): Lower beginner, medium beginner, high beginner, lower intermediate, medium intermediate, high intermediate, advanced, high advanced and superior. Students must pass tests at each level in order to progress to the next. Upon arrival a placement test is taken. Classes are 55 minutes in length and are held 8:00-12:50. Sometimes in high season classes may take place in the afternoon. Teachers are rotated every week.

Group Program The Group Program at Latin America Academy includes 20 hours per week of Spanish classes. Maximum number of students per class is 4 students, with the average being 2 students. Groups are organized in a way that they will always consist of students possessing the same level of Spanish. At the conclusion of your studies, you will receive a certificate of completion. The method is based on the 4 language skills: listening, grammar, oral and written comprehension.

Additional Tutor Option-Advanced & Superior Levels

Those students at Advanced and Superior levels who have special needs (i.e. special vocabulary, Bolivian history or literature, etc.), should inform NRCSA in advance. These special needs can be handled with a Tutor as a supplement to the Group Program. This option is available on request and at additional

Children's Tutor Program Latin America Academy can accommodate the teaching of Spanish to children ages 5-16. This program is designed as a Tutor (one-on-one) program and utilizes TV Spanish programs, audio cassettes, children's Spanish books and games to create a fun language learning atmosphere. Cost is the same as the adult Group Program. Child care may be possible upon special request.

Volunteer Opportunities Academia Latinoamericana - Bolivia has several volunteer opportunities available. Minimum Spanish language level is dependent on type of work and a minimum 2 week Spanish course is required regardless of level before volunteer program begins. Those at Beginning and Post Beginning levels are required to take at least a 4 week minimum Spanish course prior to volunteer program. Participants must have a University degree or be working toward one. These are unpaid positions. To be considered for one of the positions, please submit an introductory letter and resume along with the NRCSA Registration Form.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Homestays Your host family will take care of you and provide breakfast and dinner, and do your laundry. Most families live within 20-30 minutes walking distance. All students receive a private room unless otherwise requested. Your host family will also pick you up at the airport upon your arrival.

OF SPECIAL INTEREST

As part of the language program, our center offers 2-3 organized activities every week. In addition, students will find a daily schedule of cultural events in Sucre and surrounding areas. Activities include: Visits to local areas of interest, dance classes, cooking classes, parties, spanish languages movies, seminars & discussion groups. Entrance fees and transportation not included.

Program Overview

Nine levels of study are offered in accordance with the ACTFL guidelines (American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages): Lower beginner, medium beginner, high beginner, lower intermediate, medium intermediate, high intermediate, advanced, high advanced and superior. Students must pass tests at each level in order to progress to the next. We recognize that every student has the best insight into their educational needs, which is why we will work with each student to ensure, as best possible, that they are receiving the training and support they need. Upon arrival a placement test is given and an evaluation is made by the faculty. Results of the test and the students needs are taken into consideration and used to create the most productive program in the time available.

One of our goals is to provide excellence in education with a particular emphasis on grammar and vocabulary. To ensure the success of each student, high quality teaching materials are provided. We have published customized textbooks and guidebooks which are used in combination with other materials from universities around the world. Books provided are as follows:

- Beginner/Elementary levels: CUMBRE (SGEL) / PLANETA (EDELSA)
- Intermediate level: RAPIDO (SGEL) / PUNTOS DE PARTIDA (MC GRAW HILL)
- Advanced level: ABANICO (DIFUSÍON)
- Proficiency: CURSO DE PERFECCIONAMIENTO (SGEL)

Classes are 55 minutes in length. Students may enroll for as many weeks as desired. In order to make sufficient progress and gain the maximum benefit from the course, the following program duration ranges are recommended: Beginner (2-12 weeks), Intermediate (4-8 weeks) and advanced (2-8 weeks). Courses lasting for more than 3 months will require a visa from the Bolivian government. On the first Monday, students are given a city tour and information about the city, school, family life and culture. No formal Spanish classes take place the student's first Monday. Classes are held 8:00-10:20, break 10:20-10:50, and resume 10:50-12:50. Sometimes in high season classes may take place in the afternoon too. Teachers are rotated every week.



Group Program The Group Program includes 20 hours per week of Spanish classes. Maximum number of students per class is 4 students, with the average being 2 students. Groups are organized in a way that each group will always consist of students possessing the same level of Spanish. At the conclusion of your studies, you will receive a certificate of completion. The method is based on the 4 language skills: listening, grammar, oral and written comprehension. No English will be used in



Tutor Program The Tutor Program includes 20 hours per week of Spanish lessons with a private tutor. The program is recommended for those


students at Advanced and Superior levels who have special needs (i.e. special vocabulary, Bolivian history or literature, etc.), or any student wanting an intensive language learning program. Please inform NRCSA of any special needs in advance .

Super Intensive Group The Group Program includes 30 hours per week of Spanish classes. Maximum number of students per class is 4 students, with the average being 2 students. Course starting dates: Every Monday. Every weekly rate includes 5 days of classes (from Monday to Friday) 4 hours in small group in the morning and 2 hours on individual basis in the afternoon.

The Children's Tutor Program Special programs for students aged 5-16 are available. This program is designed as a Tutor (one-on-one) program and utilizes Spanish TV programs, audio cassettes, children's Spanish books and games to create a fun language learning atmosphere. The cost is the same as the adult Group Program.

* Please Note: Since Tutors are limited in availability, it is suggested that you make reservations for this program 2 months in advance. Child care may be possible upon special request.







Volunteer Opportunities Several volunteer opportunities are available for interested students. Minimum Spanish language level is dependent on

type of work and a minimum 2 week Spanish course is required regardless of level before volunteer program begins. Those at Beginning and Post Beginning levels are required to take at least a 4 week minimum Spanish course before beginning their volunteer program.

Participants must have a University degree or be working toward one. Volunteer positions are unpaid. Admissions & Academic Credit

Students age 18 years and older are welcomed regardless of educational background, occupation or nationality. Students under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. No previous knowledge of Spanish is required except where otherwise indicated.

Students desiring credit for their study program should contact their home school or request the NRCSA Credit Fact Sheet. Generally, U.S. universities consider 15 hours of study to be equal to 1 semester credit.

For those students who have arranged with their home college or university to receive credits for Spanish study abroad, a letter will be issued stating dates of study, hours completed, progress and level of achievement. Get a letter of instructions from your home school and advise the foreign school administrators upon arrival of your credit transfer needs.

NOTE: Classes canceled in honor of local holidays are not made up. Foreign Language schools use placement tests. If there is no group at your level, smaller group or tutor classes may be substituted with fewer hours per week. Classes are conducted entirely in the target language.
