ABOUT THE SCHOOL AND THE CITY

Amadeus is a nonprofit organization specialized in the instruction of German. Since 1990 more than 3500 students from all around the world attended their programs. Amadeus offers excellent teaching facilities in Salzburg, centrally located and equipped with modern classrooms, cassette and video recorders together with a large library of videotapes, computer assisted learning and use of the schools libraries.

Amadeus' teachers are university graduates who have been carefully selected to teach German as a foreign language.

Salzburg is beautifully situated in the heart of Europe surrounded by some of the finest countryside in the Alps. It is, however, only one and a half hours from Munich, three hours from Vienna and also not too far from Prague and Budapest. With this in mind, Salzburg, the birthplace of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, is a wonderful place to study German.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Salzburg summer program of Amadeus offers courses for students of all ages and nationalities. Amadeus offers a curriculum of well organized courses held in small class settings with active participation on a day-to-day basis. The lessons teach the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, and develop grammatical structures, increase vocabulary and encourage communicative interaction.

Adult Language & Culture Course - Ages 16 & Up At the beginning of each session students will take a proficiency exam. Based on the results of this exam students will be placed into small work groups of 8 to 10 for morning lessons. The curriculum will teach listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. Students will develop a thorough knowledge of German grammatical structures and increase their vocabulary.

During the afternoons, students may participate in excursions or cultural and educational activities where they learn about Austria and practice German on a social level. Students can either choose intensive language courses to supplement compulsory morning classes, participate in cultural activities or in sporting activities.

Music Festival Course Combined with morning language classes, this program is designed for those who love music and theatre, culture, art and history. The course enables you to get in close contact with the "Salzburger Festspiele" (Salzburg Music Festivals). The most famous artists and directors work in Salzburg during summer and you will see how they prepare themselves and their orchestra (Vienna and Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra) for operas and concerts.

Teen Summer Program- Ages 12 - 14 & 15 - 18. The Teen program includes 24 hours supervision and special activities in the afternoon. It is based on the same structure as the adult program, with morning language classes grouped according to language level. Amadeus teen students stay in 2-bed, 3-bed rooms, a maximum 5-bed rooms, in the school's dormitories on the Campus. They are equipped with TV lounge, kitchen for selfcooking, billiard and Ping-pong, salon for meetings of students and teachers. All day and all night there are persons who look after the students, organize games and video sessions.

For 12 through 14 year olds, the Intensive & Creative Program (for all levels of German) is offered. In small

groups and different levels students will practice German talking about special interests and topics and so gain practical language

For 15 through 18 year olds, Amadeus offers 3 choices of activity programs: Super Sport, Music & Culture, or the Intensive & Creative Program.

ACCOMMODATIONS

For Students Over 18 years Central located student residences, approximately 20 minutes from the school. Host family accommodation is also available upon request.

For Students Under 18 years Amadeus students have the possibility to stay in 1-bed, 2-bed or 3-bed rooms (Teen Program students stay in maximum 5-bed rooms) in the school's dormitories on the Campus.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Amadeus students can use all sports facilities on the Amadeus Campus without extra costs: You can play tennis on hard courts, soccer, basketball, volleyball and enjoy track and field activities. On the weekends Amadeus offers various excursions which will be announced at the school's office.

Programs & Activities - Salzburg, Austria

General Course Information

Our programs provide students of all ages and nationalities a chance to learn the German language, and enjoy many of the leisure time activities available for students in and around Salzburg.

Methodology

The curriculum is well organized, and classes are held in small group. There is active participation, on a day-to-day basis, by all students in the group. Individual lessons focus on the different skills required to become fluent in a language: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Courses help students to develop a thorough knowledge of grammatical structures, increase vocabulary, and encourage communicative interaction through discussions and role play. Students are encouraged to take an active part in their learning. Afternoon classes are taught, with an emphasis on a variety of focused topics, to reflect the interests of the student. This provides a forum for focused vocabulary study and interchange of ideas in German.

Students at all levels, beginning to advanced, are welcome.

Programs

Adult Language & Culture Course

The Adult Language & Culture Course is comprised of two main components:

· Morning Language Classes

At the beginning of each session students take a proficiency exam. Based on the results of this exam students will be placed into small work groups of 8 to 10 people. Each student will be encouraged to take an active part in their learning through work in pairs, group discussions and role playing. The curriculum will teach listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. Students will develop a thorough knowledge of German grammatical structures, as well as, increase their vocabulary. These compulsory classes total 45 minute lessons daily on Monday through Friday.

· Afternoon Classes and Activities

During the afternoons, students may participate in excursions or cultural and educational activities where they learn about Austria and practice German on a social level. Students can either choose intensive language courses to supplement compulsory morning classes, participate in various cultural activities or in sporting activities on the lakes and mountains around Salzburg. Students can choose according to their own interests and hobbies.

 Students range from 16 to 25 years of age and represent a variety of nationalities.

Music Festival Course

Combined with morning language classes, this program is designed for those who love music and theatre, culture, art and history. The course enables you to get in close contact with the "Salzburger Festspiele" (Salzburg Music Festivals). Many of the most famous artists and directors work in Salzburg during summer, and you will have the opportunity to see how they prepare themselves and their orchestras (Vienna and Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra) for



operas and concerts. Topics reviewed/activities include:

- Introduction to the history and culture of Salzburg
- · City tour and visits of important sights
- Introduction to the "Salzburg Music Festivals"
- Visit of a rehearsal, concert of the Salzburg Music Festivals
- Visit of a rehearsal, opera or theatre, Salzburg Music Festivals
- · Visit of the festival halls, back stage, visit of the festival exposition
- · Visit of the opera in the "Marionettentheater" (Puppet-show)
- Classical concert in the "Fürstenzimmer" of the castle "Hohensalzburg"
